
While expectations are high in all aspects of College life, students strive only towards achieving their own personal bests, Through the Challenge Grade and tutorial system, high aspirations are realised for every pupil at A-level. Academic success is not measured against league tables, but rather Valued Added for every individual. At Hurst, excellence is defined by the progress and success of *all* pupils.

A huge part of Sixth Form at Hurst is building for your future, in higher education and beyond. As students work towards A-levels, Extended Project Qualifications (EPQs), university, apprenticeship and other applications, they benefit from extensive intellectual, sporting, cultural and social programmes which see them develop into well-rounded, accomplished individuals.

Alongside their studies, an inclusive super curriculum enables students to participate in a wide range of activities. From STEM and Young Enterprise to Model United Nations (MUN) and the Combined Cadet Force (CCF), students develop key leadership and life skills.

Students receive constant support at every step of the UCAS application and university selection process. Thanks to the Highly Selective University (HSU) programme, 'Hurst Means Business', Medic and Veterinary Schemes and Oxbridge team, students benefit from specialised coaching and advice for some of the most competitive degree choices.





Led by the Director of Futures, specialised advisors in our Careers department encourage students not to focus on one single career path, but rather on developing their employability skills across the board. Through the Careers Portal, as well as Hurst's extensive alumni and parent network, students receive up to date and inspiring information on the wealth of career options available to them.

At the end of the Upper Sixth, students are well-prepared to embark on the next stage of their education, with the majority heading to their first-choice universities.

Community and Pastoral Support

Hurst provides a safe and homely setting where everyone is welcomed, respected, and valued for who they are. Caring and committed staff champion the physical health, mental wellbeing, and overall happiness of all students, and additional support is always available to those who need it.

Hurst has a genuine family feel. In the Senior School students are allocated to one of twelve houses, where they look after each other within an environment that fosters healthy competition and collaboration. Students develop a strong sense of house loyalty, and the dedication of house staff ensures that they receive excellent academic and pastoral care within this 'home away from home'.

In Upper Sixth, students join a coeducational house in which everyone has their own bedroom. Set in its own grounds, St John's provides students with an excellent transition into university and life beyond Hurst.

As Guardians and House Prefects, the Lower Sixth mentor and take care of their peers within their houses and beyond. Across the College, the work of our pupil and staff Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) Group is instrumental to promoting Hurst's inclusive, positive culture.

Through charity fundraising, environmental conservation, and the Hurst Education Trust (HET), Sixth Formers develop a sense of personal responsibility and understand how to enrich the lives of others. They appreciate the value of helping their local and global communities, making them well-prepared for life beyond the College.

St John's House

In the Upper Sixth, you will move into St John's which sits in its own grounds, conveniently close to the centre of the campus. Its structure, facilities and the light touch with which the house is managed, ensure that it provides an environment best suited to students' academic, personal and social development in their final school year.


Girls and boys are housed in separate wings, each of which has its own laundry and social space. The centre of the house contains the communal social centre including bar and kitchen. The facilities are outstanding and enable students to work together in an atmosphere similar to that found at university.

Each pupil has a study bedroom and all are encouraged to undertake independent study in their own time, not least as preparation for the less structured life they will experience later at university. There are a range of boarding options; flexi (3 nights a week), weekly (5 nights a week) and day pupils can buy packages of either 25 or 50 nights to board at their convenience.

Students manage their own community, with opportunities to arrange school functions for themselves and the rest of the College, foster links with the local community, organise charity events and establish a close working relationship with both the Prep and Senior schools.

Life in St John's provides an exciting challenge at a crucial point in a student's school career, whilst continuing to provide firm foundations for many aspects of their future life. Throughout the year, the house is a hive of academic activity with everyone pulling together in the same direction. This calm, workmanlike group knows how to have fun - but at the right time. 


Preparing for Life After Hurst

A huge part of the Sixth Form at Hurst is building for the future in Higher Education and beyond. There is a specialist Careers and Higher Education department as well as a dedicated team giving students valuable support and guidance as they consider the options that interest them.

During the Lower Sixth year students attend a Higher Education Masterclass Day where external speakers come in to share their valuable insights about the UCAS application process and how to choose the right university and former students come in to talk about their gap year experiences. In addition, the Lower Sixth students begin the important task of visiting universities as they start to think about their next steps.

Students considering Oxbridge, STEM degrees, Medicine, Veterinary Science and Dentistry are given additional support with visits to Oxford and Cambridge, tailored workshops, group discussion meetings and interview practice. Hurst is justifiably proud of its Futures programme which provides a vast range of careers talks covering almost every profession and industry. Each summer, over 70 students participate in our unique Work Experience Programme. Ranging from half-day to two-week placements, over 40 different companies - covering industries from legal services and finance to PR and healthcare - give Hurst students a valuable insight into the inner workings of their organisations. The places will show students the wide variety of career paths available to them whilst encouraging them to develop their employability skills across the board. The programme offers students tremendous opportunities to network with local companies prepare for their UCAS applications, and to potentially the the foundations for future paid work or apprenticeships.


